

Mass General Brigham Academic Surgical Pathologist with Expertise in Head & Neck and Endocrine Pathology

BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS (USA). The Department of Pathology at Brigham and Women's Hospital (BWH) and Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH), both principal teaching affiliates of Harvard Medical School and founding members of Mass General Brigham (MGB), is seeking an academically oriented, Board-certified faculty pathologist with established skills in head & neck and endocrine pathology and interest in clinical/translational research to join an outstanding team of academic surgical pathologists. Responsibilities will include covering the Head & Neck and Endocrine pathology services at BWH and/or MGH, training of anatomic pathology residents and head & neck and endocrine pathology fellows, and teaching of Harvard medical students in the fundamentals of head & neck and endocrine pathology.

The combined Pathology Department of the two institutions is staffed by more than 200 faculty members and approximately 100 residents and clinical fellows in Anatomic and Clinical Pathology in a predominantly subspecialty-oriented model. The Head & Neck Pathology service at BWH handles approximately 2,200 cases per year and the Endocrine Pathology service at BWH handles approximately 800 cases per year. The combined Head & Neck and Endocrine Pathology service at MGH handles approximately 10,600 cases per year, including cases originating from Mass Eye and Ear, a dedicated eye and ear infirmary that is part of the MGB system. The Division of Anatomic Pathology at BWH and MGH collectively handles over 200,000 surgical specimens, 110,000 cytology specimens, 60,000 molecular tests, and 10,000 cytogenetics samples annually. The environment provides substantial opportunities for clinical/translational research as well as collaborations with investigators in multiple Harvard-affiliated institutions.

Applicants should be committed to excellent patient care, as well as research, scholarship, and effective teaching. Academic rank at the Instructor, Assistant or Associate Professor level at Harvard Medical School and salary will be commensurate with experience and accomplishments. The salary range for full-time employment for this position is \$270,000 to \$295,000 per year, not inclusive of incentive compensation or benefits.
